




# Museo delle Terre Nuove

The Museo delle Terre Nuove is located in a historical building, the Palazzo d'Arnolfo, in the heart of San Giovanni Valdarno.

In thirteen thematic rooms, the museum illustrates the history of the creation of new settlements, a trend that marked a large part of medieval Europe. It also hosts regular temporary exhibitions.





The museum is located in the centre of San Giovanni Valdarno in Piazza Cavour 1, just a few steps from the railway station, and is therefore easily accessible both by public transport and by private car, which can be left in one of the adjacent car parks just a few minutes' walk away.







#### **OPENING TIMES**

The museum is open Tuesday to Friday from 3 pm to 7 pm, and on weekends from 10 am to 1 pm, and from 3 pm to 7 pm. For any special closures, please consult the website https://www.museoterrenuove.it/


